**STATEWIDE TRANSIT INFORMATION**  
There are many Bus Routes serving the Greater Wilmington and Dover Metropolitan areas and Sussex County. For detailed information and route maps, write: DTC, 400 S. Madison ST., Wilmington, DE 19801, or call (800) 652-DART.  
Paratransit services are offered by DTC for disabled, elderly, and special-needs customers. Call (800)553-3278.

**INTERSTATE SUB**

The National Trust for Historic Preservation created the National Main Street Program in 1980 to help restore vitality to downtown areas throughout the United States.

Under the coordination of the Delaware Economic Development Office, the communities of Newark, Delaware City, Dover, Milford, Rehoboth Beach, and Seaford are working within the framework of the National Main Street Program to preserve their historical treasures and enhance shopping and cultural opportunities in their traditional town centers. Each of these communities has a unique sense of place, with neighborly merchants and personalized service, wonderful architecture, and fun special events. A short detour off of the main highways will lead you to an experience of the "real Delaware."

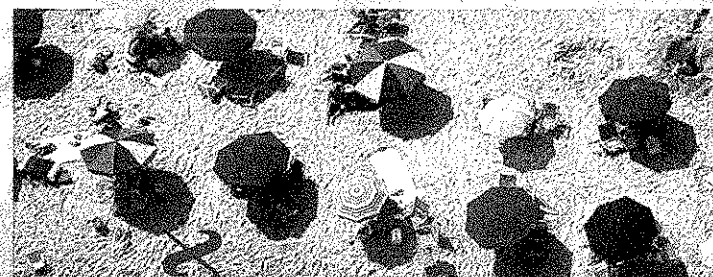

**Cycle**

Dover, Delaware's capital city, features a bustling downtown area along Lockerman Street and State Street. Shop for unique Delaware gift items and collectibles, share the coffee and conversation at a local coffee shop, treat your friend to lunch at a variety of small cafes, bring the kids to a parade or festival, or explore numerous interesting museums and historic sites within walking distance. All of these fun activities are among the setting of colonial, Victorian, and early industrial age architecture with beautiful trees and flower gardens.



**Relax**

Rehoboth Beach, on the Atlantic Ocean, is an old-fashioned family resort town. Its cottages, quaint shops and wooden boardwalk help to preserve the atmosphere of a turn-of-the-century coastal resort, while also featuring the modern-day excitement of gourmet dining, nightlife, and major special events. Spend the day shopping along Rehoboth Avenue for tax-free bargains, delight in a box of caramel popcorn or salt-water taffy, or simply enjoy the sun on your beach towel.



**Cruise**

Delaware City, on the Delaware River at the eastern end of the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal, is proud of its maritime heritage. Pick up a picnic lunch at the local deli and watch the boats go by from Battery Park on the Delaware River at the end of Clinton Street, or along the branch canal. Take a spring or summer trip to Fort Delaware State Park on Pea Patch Island and relive Civil War history. Enjoy fresh seafood and small-town charm.



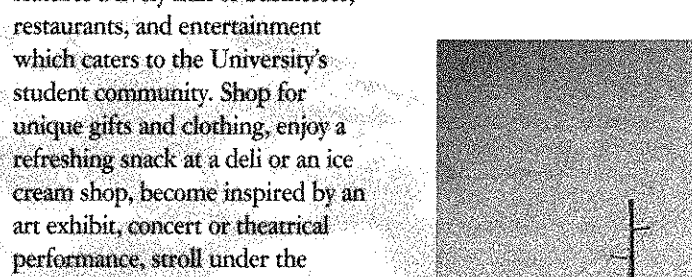
**Feast**

Newark, in the northwest corner of the state, is home to the University of Delaware. Its Main Street features a lively mix of businesses, restaurants, and entertainment which caters to the University's student community. Shop for unique gifts and clothing, enjoy a refreshing snack at a deli or an ice cream shop, become inspired by an art exhibit, concert or theatrical performance, stroll under the spreading elm trees on campus, or simply find a bench and people-watch.



**Discover**

Milford, on the Mispillion River at the boundary between Kent and Sussex Counties, is a showcase of Victorian architecture. Its old-fashioned downtown centers on Walnut Street. Shop and chat with friendly merchants and townsfolk, enjoy the view along the Mispillion Riverwalk Greenway, visit a museum or the state-of-the-art library in town, or catch a performance at the local theatre or outdoor amphitheater along the Riverwalk. Sample local produce at the weekly summer farmer's market, or indulge in a gourmet dinner nearby on Front Street.



**Explore**

Seaford, in western Sussex County on the Nanticoke River, has a small but diverse downtown area. High Street boasts many locally-owned businesses on the elevated bank of the river. Get a bouquet of flowers, or an interesting craft or antique for someone special, and enjoy a fine dinner. Purchase an item to decorate or repair your home, or pick up some office supplies. "Float-In" to downtown Seaford's Gateway Park by boat, raft, or inner tube during this fun special event each summer.

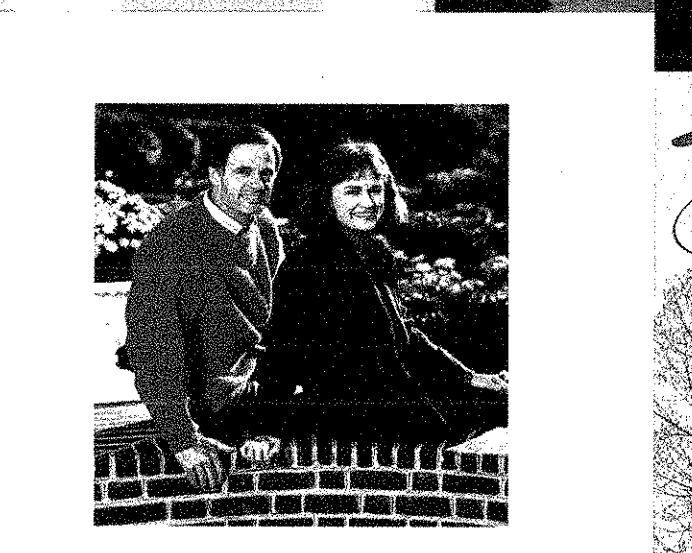
