


## 8.0 CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

The historic structures report presents the results of the investigations associated with the proposed replacement of BR 159 James Street over the Christina River. Based upon preliminary investigations it was anticipated that two resources would be documented and evaluated for the NRHP: BR 159 James Street over Christina River and Krebs Pigment & Color Corporation Building A-47. A third resource, the NRHP listed Joseph Tatnall House, is located on the tax parcel abutting the project bridge. The Joseph Tatnall House is not within the view shed of the proposed project. BR 159 James Street over Christina River was previously determined not eligible and the field investigation confirmed that evaluation. The Krebs Pigment & Color Corporation Building A-47 is recommended eligible for the NRHP under Criterion A, for its association with the chemical industry in the Town of Newport, and Criterion C, as a representative example of the Neoclassical-style. The period of significance for the Krebs Pigment & Color Corporation Building A-47 is recommended as 1937 to 1962 (50 year cut off). The boundary recommended for the Krebs Pigment & Color Corporation Building A-47 conforms to the footprint of the structure and extends to include the fenced enclosure adjacent to the façade (**See Figure 16**).


