

Cover Illustration: Sumpweed. The charred sumpweed (*Iva annua*) was the most significant plant material recovered from Site 7S-F-68. Sumpweed (*Iva annua*) is an oily-seeded annual with a seed similar to a small sunflower seed. The seed (called an achene) consists of a kernel attached to a thin dry shell which is called the pericarp. Sumpweed achenes have been found in numerous archaeological contexts which suggests that it was an important prehistoric food source.
