


Public Notice: Waterway Restrictions at Indian River Inlet Bridge



What's Happening:

In November Skanska began a new phase of construction for the new Indian River Inlet Bridge utilizing two traveling form systems (shown above). The form travelers will hang below the current existing bridge structure restricting navigable portions of the inlet in some locations.

When:

November 2010 - October 2011

What this means to you:

As construction continues from both sides, mariners should avoid navigation under the form travelers. Anglers should take note that fishing from either under or around the form travelers will be prohibited at all times. During the period when the form system launches forward mariners should be aware that the traveler will be approximately seven feet lower than during concreting position (see above). This process will last about 24 to 36 hours and happen once every two - three weeks. At no time will the water-way be closed to marine traffic.

For those needing access:

During the construction period local emergency and state officials will have access through the restricted areas as needed. Should any mariner need to travel through the restricted area they should contact the Skanska field office at the number listed to the right:
