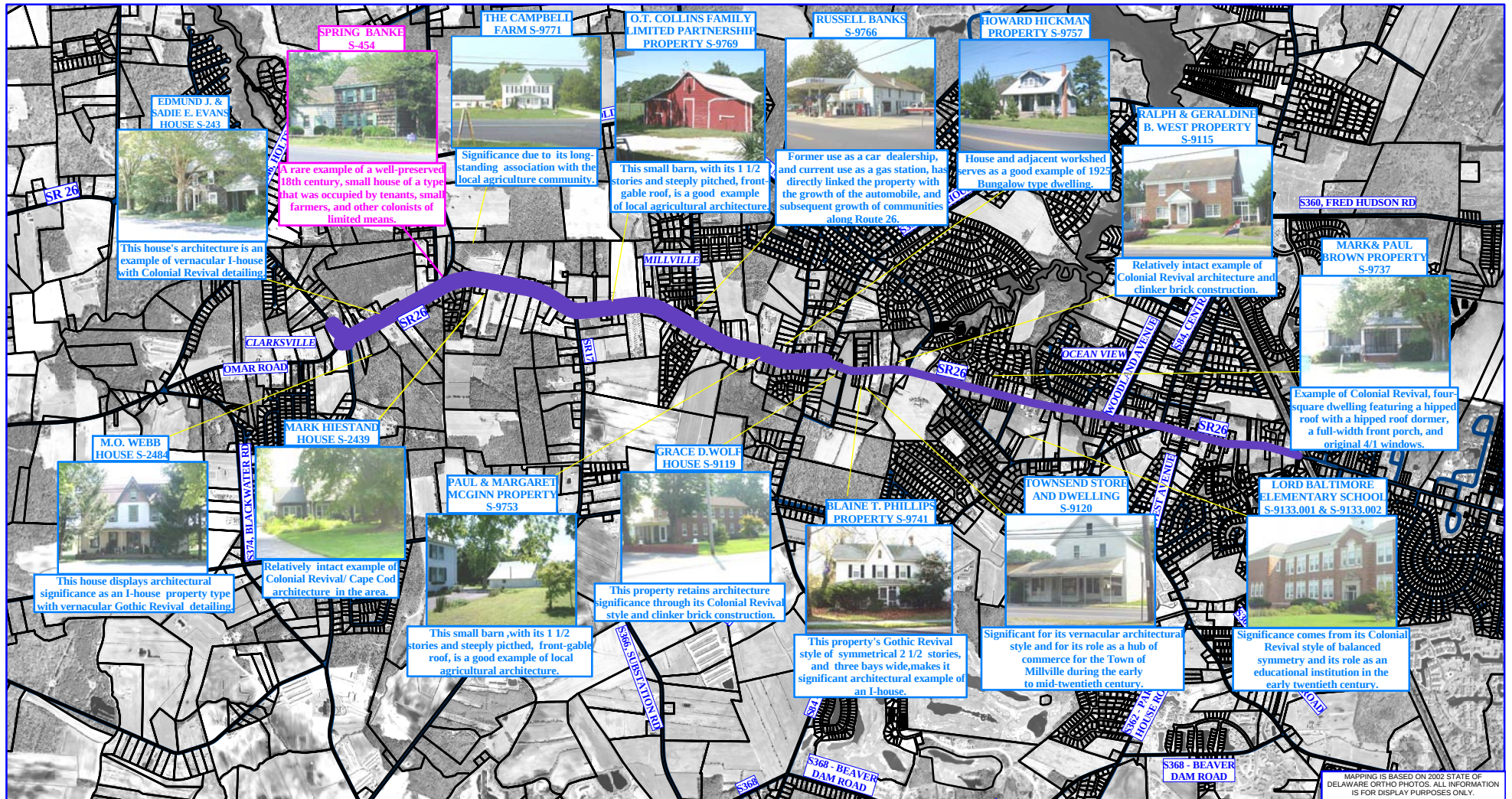




- THE CAMPBELL FARM S-9771**
Significance due to its long-standing association with the local agriculture community.
- O.T. COLLINS FAMILY LIMITED PARTNERSHIP PROPERTY S-9769**
This small barn, with its 1 1/2 stories and steeply pitched, front-gable roof, is a good example of local agricultural architecture.
- RUSSELL BANKS S-9766**
Former use as a car dealership, and current use as a gas station, has directly linked the property with the growth of the automobile, and subsequent growth of communities along Route 26.
- HOWARD HICKMAN PROPERTY S-9757**
House and adjacent workshop serves as a good example of 1920's Bungalow type dwelling.
- EDMUND J. & SADIE E. EVANS HOUSE S-243**
This house's architecture is an example of vernacular I-house with Colonial Revival detailing.
- SPRING BANK S-454**
A rare example of a well-preserved 18th century, small house of a type that was occupied by tenants, small farmers, and other colonists of limited means.
- RALPH & GERALDINE B. WEST PROPERTY S-9115**
Relatively intact example of Colonial Revival architecture and clinker brick construction.
- MARK & PAUL BROWN PROPERTY S-9737**
Example of Colonial Revival, four-square dwelling featuring a hipped roof with a hipped roof dormer, a full-width front porch, and original 4/1 windows.
- M.O. WEBB HOUSE S-2484**
This house displays architectural significance as an I-house property type with vernacular Gothic Revival detailing.
- MARK HIESTAND HOUSE S-2439**
Relatively intact example of Colonial Revival/ Cape Cod architecture in the area.
- PAUL & MARGARET MCGINN PROPERTY S-9753**
This small barn, with its 1 1/2 stories and steeply pitched, front-gable roof, is a good example of local agricultural architecture.
- GRACE D. WOLF HOUSE S-9119**
This property retains architecture significance through its Colonial Revival style and clinker brick construction.
- BLAINE T. PHILLIPS PROPERTY S-9741**
This property's Gothic Revival style of symmetrical 2 1/2 stories, and three bays wide, makes it significant architectural example of an I-house.
- TOWNSEND STORE AND DWELLING S-9120**
Significant for its vernacular architectural style and for its role as a hub of commerce for the Town of Millville during the early to mid-twentieth century.
- LORD BALTIMORE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL S-9133.001 & S-9133.002**
Significance comes from its Colonial Revival style of balanced symmetry and its role as an educational institution in the early twentieth century.
