- Personnel updates
- Triennial Highway Safety Plan approved by NHTSA
- Annual Grant Application approved
- Grant funding provided within the parameters of a Continuing Resolution – not all funds provided immediately
- Working with DSP we saw the successful deployment of the new Intoxilizer 9000's to the field
- Delaware Office of Highway Safety presented the Peter O'Rourke Special Achievement award by GHSA

Updates



- New CPS law effective June 30, 2024
- Improved safety for all passengers especially our most vulnerable
- First offense requires referral to OHS Child Passenger Safety specialists for education
- Fines may be levied after first offense

 Renewing our partnership with Mothers Against Drunk Driving (MADD) post-COVID









Commercial Motor Vehicle Grant (FMCSA)

- To educate and enforce non-CMVs who display unsafe traffic behaviors around CMVs.
 - According to DSP, many of the fatal crashes in Delaware involving CMVs are not the fault of the CMV driver.
 - This grant is to focus on the behavior of others operating around CMVs.

OHS will continue to look for new and innovative funding sources to focus on critical areas of concern.
