PREFACE BY LEWIS CASS WELDIN (336)

This record has been over 50 years in preparation. We became interested in finding out the relation of the various families of the name of Weldin living in our vicinity when quite a young man. There were three or four branches of the family who were not aware that they were related at all. Those intermarrying were sure they were no relation to each other whatever. This aroused our curiosity. Repeated inquiries of the older members seemed to give little reliable information. We procured a small blank book and started out in earnest to record all names and facts readily obtainable. This book made in pencil was the original of the present record. Coming upon this little record among some old papers, at least twenty years after it was made, we were inspired to continue the work. From that time to the present the work has never been lost sight of, although pursued at intervals sometimes of years. We have become almost a genealogist by its pursuit and have become familiar with much of the Colonial history of Delaware, Pennsylvania and New Jersey. We have examined many volumes of records, so readily reached in recent years, and enlisted many more expert than ourself in the search for data. Very exhaustive examinations of county records, Friends Meeting records and published genealogists of connected and related families in many states have been made at our request and expense.

Colonial archives and government documents available have been read and compared, and every clue to a lost member diligently followed up. This work, to us, has been very interesting and sometimes, amusing as well. We have had many surprises and by the voluminous correspondence made many friends. It has been a great pleasure to re-unite relatives separated for years and who were often under the impression that the unknown had passed away in a distant state. We are grateful for the voluntary help of many correspondents and have not hesitated to copy such data as was found in the genealogies of other families. The Smedley Genealogy; the Talley History and Genealogy; the collection of Miss Hanna R. Weldin; the Cope and Futhey History of Chester County; the Genealogy of the Stern Family, and many others. Many of these publications furnished but little we could use but to all we acknowledge indebtedness. We cannot mention personally the dozens of descendants who have gone to great trouble and some expense to answer our repeated inquiries. No record could be made without the co-operation of those interested.

This record relates to the descendants of two brothers, Jacob and Ely Weldin (ing).

The first authentic records that we have found referring to these brothers is in the minutes of the "New Ark Mo. Meeting of Friends". There we find this note dated seventh month, eighth, 1725, "Jacob Welding requests a certificate in behalf of his

brother, Ely Welding, to Bi-Berry Mo. M't'g." This date is probably not correct as Ely seems to have married by permission of Abbington M. M't'g. in 1721. Also Ely and his wife obtained a certificate from Abbington to Buckingham in 1723. In the year 1721, Joseph Ely, a scrivener of Salem N.J. bequeathed all his property to his loving kinsman, Jacob Welding, of Rockland Manor. In the year 1722, Jacob Weldin received a deed from Thomas Hollingsworth for a tract of two hundred acres of land on Shell Pot Creek in Rockland Manor, now Brandywine Hundred, Delaware. These give the permanent location and earliest dates referring to the two brothers whose descendants we propose to trace.

The Friends' records in Delaware give Welding as the recorded form. We have a copy, however, of a deed made by Jacob in 1760, the signature to which shows no "g" at the end. The descendants of Jacob have never used the "g" ending, while the descendants of Eli have always retained the final "g".

Jacob and Eli were blacksmiths by trade as were many of their descendants. Beginning with the village where Eli had his shop in Bucks County, Pa., many towns have been named by them in many states of the Union. These names of towns and Post Offices are now uniformly spelled Weldon but this is a manifest injustice to the Weldins and Weldings of this family who founded many of them. This, our records show, especially in the western states.

There was an extensive emigration to Ohio and farther West from Delaware by the descendants of Jacob about the year 1818 or perhaps a little earlier. We also find that the succeeding generations kept moving as the country settled up and are now resident in every state to and including California.

As handed down to us of the Rockland Manor branch, the family name is spelled Weldin and has been so spelled for two hundred years. We are aware, however, that a great variety of ways of spelling the name have been and are yet in use among the related branches.

The origin of the name is Norman *, and the earliest records are said to have many references to it. In the time of William, the Conqueror, as the English records show, Bertramus de Weltdene was the head of the family. We are in possession of a copy of a genealogical chart for fifteen generations made in 1685 which shows several branches of the original de Weltdenes, who, holding various positions at the English Court, saw fit to change the spelling of the name, although we have no doubt whatever but that the pronunciation has always been the same. This we may infer from the motto's "Bein Fait" and "Bona Faat" used at various times. In this chart we see the oldest branch retaining the "t" and dropping the final "e" so that at last we have

Weltden. In the second branch we find the "h" dropped and finally the spelling Weldin used. Another branch used Weldon, Welden, Weldin by turns and the youngest branch, like the oldest, uses Weltden. This chart reaches to 1685, a date at which most of the early settlements in Delaware, Virginia and New York, and even Pennsylvania had been founded. Several emigrants with names identical with those in the chart arrived from England and Wales. We might therefore expect to find that the name appears in America exactly as used in the old country. Instead, however, we find the most bewildering changes, even among brothers and cousins; yet all American families claiming that a Weldin is a Weldin no matter how his name is spelled.

We are unable to trace our branch farther back than the two brothers, Jacob and Ely, who were both blacksmiths, born or settling in Rockland Manor in New Castle Co., Delaware, about the year 1700. They were Quakers and their names appear as Welding in the Friends' Records.

ORIGINAL EMIGRANT

1681

The Founder, we think, Isaac Wheelden of Sahoost Derbingshire, Wales, joined his fortunes with those who followed William Penn into the wooded wilderness of Pennsylvania. He was a Quaker, and was the first to purchase one thirty-second interest in 5000 acres in the Welsh Barony from the original owners, John ap John and Thomas Wynne, his countrymen, who had their right from Penn.

This John ap John was spoken of by his neighbors as a man of great integrity and devotion to the Society of Friends. Isaac had surveyed to him as his part of the property, two hundred acres of land along Darby Creek, then Chester, now Delaware County, at the location of the cotton mills known as Glenwood and Clifton.

1682

He seems to have lived in Philadelphia, probably arriving there in the ship "Lyon" which brought the Welsh emigrants in 1682. This was at the time Penn himself and his Quaker followers were coming to Penn's new acquisition of the West side of the Delaware. About thirty vessels arrived in that year, bringing many Friends from England, Wales and Ireland, to enjoy the freedom of the new land and escape the persecutions of the old.

Isaac was described in the deed to him as a glover, and in a deed ten years later, as a skinner, so that we may presume that he was a fur and skin merchant, this being the principal business of the early emigrants.

Letters of attorneys, by which he was empowered to manage and sell the interests of others who, it is presumed, owned parts in the ap John and other tracts but did not leave their own country at all, are on record. In this way, many interests were transferred even before a regular surveyed location was assigned to them.

1684

In 1684, we find Isaac bought a tract of land of 220 acres situated on the west side of the Delaware river and east side of a branch of Blackbird Creek in New Castle County, Delaware. This tract of land was called "Dalton" following the custom of the times of giving a name to every plantation. We regret this custom has not continued as a force in holding the descendants to the old home and a rallying center for the future generations. This particular home property was in Appaquinamink Hundred. Here Isaac seems to have made his home at last and here his descendants are still to be found. We find in a deed to Samuel Levis of a part of the original Darby Creek tract that he is described as of New Castle County, Delaware.

1695

In 1695 we find him as an attorney making a deed in Delaware but described as of Cape May County, New Jersey. Again in two or three documents recorded in Philadelphia in 1687 we find him called a citizen of that town; also in 1695 the year in which his residence is given as Cape May County, New Jersey, we find in that county records of the purchase of 150 acres of land by Joseph Willdin (probably his son or nephew), (This Joseph is the progenitor of all the C.M. Co. Wheelbins.) from the agents of Dr. Cox of the West Jersey Society. We presume, therefore, that Isaac lived in Philadelphia from 1681 to about 1688 as we find him a member of Penn's Council for New Castle County, in 1689. Then he seems to have lived for a few years in New Jersey about 1695 but in 1699 we find his will recorded in New Castle County, Delaware files and the same year a deed made by his executors, Joseph Wheelbin (probably a son) and William Robinson, both of Appaquinamink Hundred. So that he, no doubt, died in that year in Delaware.

1699

Isaac, therefore, lived in America from 1682 to 1699, a term of seventeen years, in which he was an active and prominent citizen, serving as a member of the government body, making many sales for others and handling hundreds of acres of low priced forest land as shown by the records of three counties.

1700

Isaac having died seems, as far as our records show, to have left but one son, Joseph, who, with William Robinson, settled the estate. The name of Robinson was prominent in Colonial days and was often connected with that of our own family.

1721

The next date, 1721, is of the will of Joseph Wheelbin, described as of Duck Creek. He left a widow named Bridget and four sons, Isaac, Joseph and John and Jacob. Of this Isaac we know but little. He seems to have remained near his father's home, probably occupying the home place willed to him by his mother. His own will filed in 1746 mentions his wife, Anna, and sons, Joseph, William and Abraham. John's will filed in 1767 mentions his sons, John, James, and Joseph and grandson, William Shaw. In 1781, the will of Joseph filed gives his wife's name as Sarah and daughters, Elida and Elizabeth. John also is accounted for. This Joseph, no doubt of a later generation than the son of Joseph of 1721. Therefore, we have not accounted for Joseph of 1721 nor his brother Jacob.

These brothers born about 1700 or possibly a little earlier came into their property in February, 1721, or within the year following that date. On Nov. 20, 1722,

Jacob of our record, received a deed for 200 acres of land formerly patented to Thomas Hollingsworth on Turkey Run in Brandywine Hundred, Delaware. Also in 1718, a Joseph appears as a witness at Chester Mo. meeting. One John also figures as a member of the Friends' Meeting and in the tax lists of Chester County, Pennsylvania, 1722 to 1727. So that it seems to us that this Joseph and John were sons of Joseph who made his will in 1721.

1722

The Friends' records show that our Jacob, who had a deed from Hollingsworth in 1722 had a brother Ely named, no doubt, from Joseph Ely who made Joseph Welding his heir. We have no other mention of this Ely in Delaware although it is an easy matter to trace his life afterward by means of the Friends' records in Bucks Co. Pa.

Tradition connects these Weldings, Wheeldon and Whilldon and they are accounted as of the same origin.

OTHER EMIGRANTS

The old Norman name seems to have had many representatives scattered over England, Ireland and Wales, at the time that the tide of emigration set toward America. They were among the earliest to join the colonies. There must have been many original emigrants rather than one or even the traditional three brothers. The early members seem to have formed at least four groups located respectively in Virginia, Pennsylvania, New York and along the coast of Connecticut and Massachusetts. The spelling of the name is very confusing although the pronunciation seems to have been the same. This is indicated by the tendency of non-members to use Weldon. Many of the pioneer settlers, even in Ohio, Indiana and Illinois, seem to have shown their independence by using their own taste in selecting one of the various ways of spelling the name then in use. The two great lines of migration taken by the early settlers in moving westward are indicated in the history of the travels of the members of this family. Northward, say from Eastern New York to Connecticut or Massachusetts; then Westward by Northern New York, Pennsylvania and Ohio, leaving representatives at every resting place. Or South, say from Philadelphia or Virginia or Maryland or the Carolinas, then Northwestward to West Virginia, Western Pennsylvania and thence to Central Ohio, Indiana and Illinois and on to the Pacific.

We have corresponded with many people with the name or similar names, often in this way finding again a lost trace of some of the wanderers. Taking these names from directories or wherever an address could be obtained we have, of course, reached many not connected with the branch of the great family which we are tracing.

We have thought best to preserve some of these facts for the interest they possess as history and also hoping that in time they may help some other geneologist.

The following are a few historic notes and extracts from our correspondence.

1610-1630 Mrs. Ida M. (Weldon) Fulmer of Cleveland, Ohio, writes that her ancestors are understood to have settled first in New Amsterdam (New York) between 1610 and 1630. They moved to the new settlements on the coast of Connecticut and Massachusetts and were also among the Yankees who afterward moved to the then West in New York state. A William Weldon, her ancestor, settling in the Mohawk Valley and there marrying a Miss Walradt, a descendant of the Holland emigrants. These Weldens scattered over that part of New York and some went to Northern Pennsylvania and Ohio. They suppose the original emigrants to have been English or Irish.

1619 Hotten's "Early Emigrant Ancestors; 1624" gives, in a list of muster rolls of College lands, that Anthony Weltden arrived in the ship "Society of Boston" in 1619 and that William Weldon came in the ship "Bona Nova".

1620 In the Plymouth Colony, Governor Giles Hopkins married Catharine Wheildon; Hannah, daughter of Capt. John Gorham of the Mayflower Colonists married a Wheelding, at Barnstable, New York, where her parents were then living after they returned to America. Hannah and her husband settled in Cape May County, New Jersey, and are recognized as the ancestors of the Whilldins of New Jersey.

1630 In "Genealogies and Estates of Charleston, Massachusetts" by Wyman, we find that Capt. Robert Weldon died of consumption Feb 16, 1630.

Savage's "Genealogical Dictionary" gives the name of Elizabeth, widow of Capt. Robert Weldon, among the members of one of the early churches in Massachusetts in 1630, also Henry Whelding, who may be the father or brother of Catharine who married in 1630 to Giles Hopkins.

1675 Rev. John Weldon, minister of Parish St. Mary, Newington, County Surry, England, staying in Virginia, was made guardian for Sarah, daughter of Peter Efford of York County. She afterward married his son Samuel in London and they came to James City in 1675, York County. Records noted in "Wm. and Mary Quarterly, Vol. 6, PP. 121".

- 1719 A descendant Samuel Weldon (Benjamin) served on the Grand Jury in 1719. From this branch came many of the Weldons of the South and Southeast. They were in both armies in the War of the Rebellion and several are at present in the Government employ. Many towns and Post-offices have derived their names from descendants of Virginia Weldons who were pioneers in early settlements.
- 1682 Isaac Wheeldon, glover, of Sancoost, Wales, bought in 1681, a one thirty-second share in 5000 acres of land to be laid off in the Welsh tract or barony arranged for by William Penn. This was one of the earliest sales and two hundred acres were surveyed for him on Darby Creek, now in Darby Township, Delaware County, Pennsylvania. Isaac arrived in 1682 and resided in Philadelphia, also in Delaware and at one time in Cape May County, New Jersey. He had a tract of land at Appaquinamink Hundred, N.C. County, Delaware, and died in Delaware in 1699. He was the ancestor of some of the Delaware Weldons, if not of the New Jersey Whildons, also.
- 1695 Joseph Whilldin bought 150 acres of land in Cape May County, N.J. of the agent of Dr. Cox and the West Jersey Society.
- 1710 Dr. F. Stanford Welden writes that his ancestor of four or five generations back was Jonathan Wheldon who settled on New Haven, Conn. Another ancestor, Jonathan Wheldon, was Lieutenant in the Continentals and one of his ancestors came to Long Island where the line is represented by the Doctor who is in dental practice in Brooklyn.
- 1800 S.G. Whelden, Providence, Rhode Island, says his father, James and Uncle Benjamin Whelden came to Massachusetts from Wales about one hundred years ago; (probably much earlier).
- E.O. Weldin of Chicago, La wn, Ill., says his people have resided many years in Herkemer and Oneda Counties, New York, and are of English origin. Miss Gertrude Welden of St. Louis, Missouri, writes that her father, Joseph G. was born in Syracuse, New York, and that her grandfather, Thomas, came from England. She says that the name used to be spelled Weldin. Arthur Weldon, Chippaway Falls, N.Y. says his father's name was Stephen and that he came from Liverpool.
- 1883 James T. Welding of New York City came from Blackburn, Lanca shire, England, fifteen years ago (1908) where his brothers and sisters still live.

1883

Jas. S. Weldon, Post Master, St. Clair, Mo. writes that his grandfather, Thomas, was born near Weldon, N.C., He removed to South Carolina about 1812 and later to Sangamon Co., Ill. A son. moved to Pike Co. Indiana.

James M. Weldon, Racine, Ohio, writes that his father, John, was born in the eastern part of Old Virginia. His grandfather, Edward, moved to Washington, Pennsylvania, about 1747 and the family afterwards moved to Point Pleasant, now West Virginia and then to Chester, Ohio, and then to Racine. They were Irish or Scotch Irish. This is a fair illustration of the movements of the descendants of the early emigrants and shows how they scattered out to occupy the new country. These are descendants of several emigrants.

1937

Laura H. Nelson, 10 N. Locust St., Oxford, Ohio, writes that her Great Grandmother, Ann Weldon, B. 1793 in Del., m. Wm. Fields (1815?). Had da. Mary b. 1816, son Allen b. 1819, also Daniel Weldon Fields, Jane, Benjamin, Martha and Isabella, which names she says repeat through the generations.

Jacob Weldin (2) 1700, resided on a farm in Brandywine Hundred, New Castle Co. Del. He was a blacksmith by trade, owned 200 acres of upland and a tract of marsh land on Cherry Island. He was an active member of the Friends Meeting at Newark, which was near by. The plain tomb stones in the old burying ground give no names nor dates to help us to know his wife's name or the dates usually so recorded.

There were probably several daughters as the records of the old Swede's Church at Wilmington, Del. show the marriages of Mary, Elizabeth, Eliza, Jeannette and two Sarahs, between 1748 and 1752 who may have been sisters and cousins of Isaac and Joseph.

Ely Welding (3) married Elizabeth Beal, daughter of Wm. Beal, at that time a citizen of Upper Dublin, by Friends ceremony Nov. 27, 1721. June 23, 1723, they received a certificate to Buckingham Monthly Meeting, Bucks County, Penna.

As we have seen in the history of his brother Joseph, Ely was a Friend, a blacksmith and was a resident of Weldon, a small town near Abbington, Bucks County, Penna. He married Elizabeth Beal as shown in the Abbington Monthly Meeting minutes, 1st of 10th Mo. 1721 and took a certificate of removal to Buckingham Monthly meeting, 4 Mo. 1723. The village and post office are no doubt named for him, although the post office department has made a uniform way of spelling for all the Weldon post offices. The spelling is "Welding" on the Friends records. This Bucks County branch has always used the final "g" long ago dropped by all the Delaware Weldins. They had one son, John

Welding (6) b. 1722 d. 1760, who bought a tract of 172 1/2 acres of land in Buckingham Township, where he resided until his death in June 1771. He was an active member of the Friends Meeting and served in many important positions. Elizabeth died May 1773.

THIRD GENERATION

Isaac Weldin (4). We find no record of his wife's name. + It is probably given in the New Ark Friends records as he seems to have adhered to the Quakers. These records are not indexed. His will was recorded Sept. 5, 1788. He lived near the old home place.

Of the four daughters; Elizabeth, Margaret, Sarah, and Mary, very little is known to us. From the Old Swede's Church records we learn that Elizabeth married Foster. Margaret, John Kinsman, and Sarah, John Smith. We have no record of Mary. The Smiths joined the party who went west about 1818, and of whom we are yet unable to learn the history. The sons, George, Eli, and Jacob, and daughter Elizabeth settled near the old home. These people seem to have left the Friends Society about or after the meetings were removed from New Ark 1708.

Their names appearing on the Swede's Church records as early as 1747, and in 1734, in Christ Church, Philadelphia.

+ There is a record in Old Swede's Church of the marriage of Isaac Welding and Sarah Dearborn, Dec. 27, 1766. Which may be a second marriage of this Isaac. He mentions his wife in his will in 1788.

Joseph Weldin (5) m. Aug. 2, 1751, Margaret Robinson, daughter of George Robinson and grand-daughter of Valentine Hollingsworth, Emigrant. She was born 1731. He died 1783. Joseph was a saddler by trade. He owned and resided on a farm near the family home. He also received from his father the tract of marsh land bought of Hollingsworth. Letters of administration were issued to his widow Margaret Nov. 30, 1783.

JOHN WELDING (6) m. in 1747, Hannah Watson, a descendant of Mathew and Ann (Manlever) Watson of Scarborough, Eng., who emigrated in 1682. He was one of the proprietors of West Jersey, owning a twelfth interest therein. He was a chemist of wealth and education. John and Hannah (Watson) Welding first settled upon a farm in Buckingham Twp., Bucks Co., near his parents, but removed to Chesterfield, N.J. in 1788. They were Friends and the Friends records of Chesterfield and Buckingham contain their names and those of their children.

George Weldin (8) m. Feb. 27, 1781, Elizabeth Allmond, daughter of John Allmond, Sr., (sister of Mary who married his brother Jacob, at the old Swede's Church and on the same day) - Elizabeth was born in 1755 and lived to be 66 years of age. She died Oct. 27, 1821, surviving her husband 25 years, She did not remarry. See biography of George, Appendix '.

Isabella Weldin (9) m. Sept. 14, 1786, Daniel Sharpley. This marriage is recorded in the Old Swede's Church as is the baptism of their son Daniel, Jr. Mr. Sharpley lived but a few years after their marriage. Isabella married, about 1790, Jacob Smith, a widower, son of Wm. (and Ann) who died about 1800. He was born Jan. 3, 1757 and died May 17, 1844. Mr. Smith, like many of his relatives took the side of the Mother Country in the troubles of the revolution and found it desirable to remove to Canada during the war. While there, his first wife died after having a son - John(?). On his return to Penna., he married Isabella, and continued to reside on his property in Delaware County near Elam, P.O. Pa.
