Increased radio coverage for three divisions of the Department—

Additional maintenance chores—

A vigorous economy and efficiency program which saved the State's taxpayers \$23,700—

These were the highlights of the year's work by the State Communications Division.

The Division installed the necessary base station equipment in the new sub troop building at Rehoboth for the State Police.

The Mosquito Control Division's radio equipment was revamped to provide better service when that division moved into its new quarters.

The Freeway Division was established during this year and the Communications Division gave it a radio system by installing a remote control of the highway net and four mobile units.

In addition, radio equipment was installed in a new Sussex County Civil Defense Center at Fort Miles.

All of these additions to regular work such as maintaining fire company, and ambulance, and other State agencies' radio equipment, resulted in an increase in maintenance work. The added costs were offset by the economy and efficiency program which saw a sum of \$23,700 returned to the General Fund at year's end.
