The Five Points Transportation Study, Phase 2 kicked off with a Working Group meeting on April 29, 2019. Much like Phase 1, we appreciate and need your continued participation in this public process.

## Upcoming Meetings...We Heard You

At the April 29th Five Points Working Group meeting, the project team stated that the intent for Phase 2 was to meet "2-3" times per year. The Working Group members and members of the public expressed the need for greater participation and involvement. Therefore, the Five Points Working Group, Phase 2 will be meeting on a Quarterly basis. The dates we have scheduled so far are
