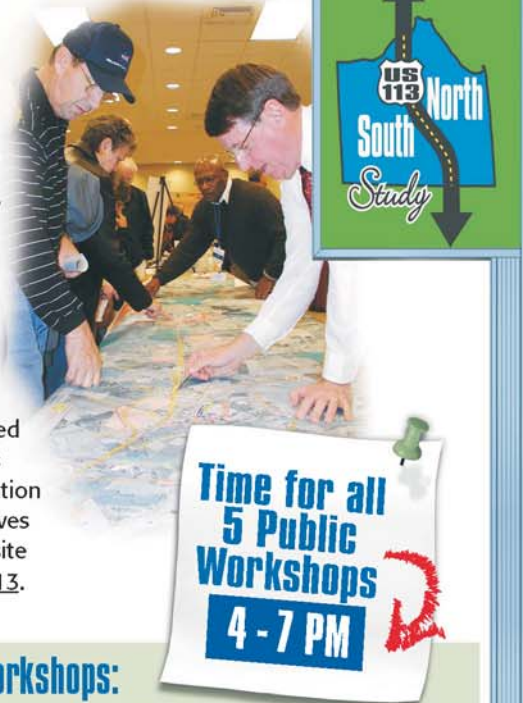




Which options should be studied in more detail for US 113?

The proposed preliminary US 113 roadway alternatives have been refined since they were presented at public workshops in November 2004. These refinements were based on comments received at the public workshops in Milford, Ellendale, Georgetown, Millsboro, and Selbyville, as well as input from environmental resource agencies, and four Community Working Groups.

Your continued involvement at public meetings is vital in helping us determine which solutions should be retained for detailed study and which should be eliminated from further consideration. Purpose Of Workshop: Present And Listen

Since the study's last round of public workshops in November 2004, the preliminary alternatives have been refined based on information provided at those public workshops and input from the four (4) community Working Groups (Milford Area, Ellendale Area, Georgetown Area, and Millsboro-South Area) and the Environmental Resource Agencies.

The purpose of this fourth round of public workshops is to provide input that will help DeIDOT determine which preliminary alternatives should be retained for detailed study and which alternatives should be eliminated from further consideration. DeIDOT anticipates making a decision on alternatives retained for detailed study during the Summer 2005. DeIDOT anticipates presenting the results of the progress made to date in the evaluation of the alternatives retained for detailed study at a series of public workshops in Fall 2005 .
